Background:

Since the first Leicester conference, which was pioneered by staff of the Tavistock Institute of Human Relations in 1957, Group Relations conferences have been understood as educational events which are based on learning through experience. Strategic and structural dynamics of organisations are studied and explored from a psychoanalytic-systemic perspective. The knowledge is acquired and then applied by working through the conscious and unconscious dynamics of leadership and management in groups, organisations and systems. The Leicester Conference has become the fundamental model for similar conferences held in many countries around the world. It has been adapted and modified over the years to be useful as a laboratory of reflection in various local contexts including the social, cultural, religious, spiritual, geographical and theoretical.

Purpose of the Belgirate Meetings:

Since 2003, the Belgirate scientific meetings have become a meta-study hub where staff practitioners of Group Relations come together to share, explore and reflect upon the theory, practice, discourse and values of the Group Relations field and the changes that have taken place over time.

The focus of Belgirate VII will be on our identity as well as the nature of our theoretical discourse and practice. We will concentrate not only on content but also on the conscious and unconscious ways we look at ourselves.

In that sense Belgirate offers an opportunity for a 'Selfie': an invitation to the 'family' (GR practitioners only) to reflect on our work and professional community, especially in these times. What is the nature of our reflective methods? What do we see? What would a 'tourist' see?

Primary Task of this Meeting:

To make a 'Selfie' of the current state of our Group Relations community by exploring the lived experience of our identity, theory and practice in these pandemic-affected times.

Participants:

This meeting is open only for people who have held staff roles: administrative, consultative and/or directorial, in Group Relations conferences. Please see Administrative Information further down for early bird registration fee.

Meeting Events:

Opening Plenary: This opening session will include an introduction to the meeting and an opportunity to share experiences of crossing the boundary into this space as staff practitioners in the Group Relations field. Participants will have an opportunity to become better acquainted with some of their colleagues in very small group settings.

Keynote Lectures: There will be two keynote lectures focusing on the themes of the meeting. Each lecture will be followed by buzz groups and a general discussion with the lecturer. Scheduled lecturers and their topics are:

"Into the heart of darkness" our Ecological self in the 4th Epoch

Leslie B Brissett PhD JP is Director of the Group Relations Programme at the Tavistock Institute of Human Relations. He is curious about the capacity of the Group Relations community to "practice what we preach" by exploring our striving to live as a collective. How do we see differently from a psychoanalytically informed systemic lens on personal and organisational challenges. Leslie directed the Leicester Conference from 2016 to 2020, the latter for the first time outside of UK, in Bavaria.

Daily Selfie: The second, third and fourth days will open in this session where participants will be invited to share thoughts and night dreams to enhance the process of sense-making of the 'Selfie' developing within this meeting and the wider Group Relations discourse, both virtual and actual. The sessions will be convened by two participants.

Virtual Group Relations Conference Panel: Digital or online GRC's were happening even before the Coronavirus pandemic but have become much more common since the spring of 2020. Over two sessions, the session will be introduced and then the panel will present four experiences / perspectives on virtual or online GRC's. Whether inter-agency or international, the presenters will share the successes and continuing challenges of these approaches to GRC's. There will be time for questions and discussion.

Parallel Presentations: These presentations will comprise three to four parallel presentations in each of three sessions. The presentations will each be chaired by a participant.

Exploratory Event: Participants are invited to engage with the meeting themes in different ways to those that have been used thus far, in order to explore the influence of specific conditions, socio-technology and emerging culture of our Group Relations field. The event will open and close in plenary.

Closing Plenary and review groups: This session will review the meeting as a whole, in order to further the sense-making and understanding of our identity as Group Relations practitioners, as the meeting draws to a close.

We work nationally and internationally to promote a learning culture through developing capacity to think through actions, to change and understand both change dynamics and the resistance to it and to put new insights into practice. Group Relations is our core *learning through experience* practice. Our Group Relations Programme (GRP) is the leading experiential learning method in the world as is our flagship GRC: Task Authority Organisation, the TAO of Tavistock Institute, known as the Leicester Conference. Our GRP staff lead and publish on Group Relations theory and practice internationally.
